

ONE SC FUND REQUEST FOR PROPOSALS

Overview

The One SC Fund, established by former Governor Nikki Haley in November 2015, was first used to support nonprofit organizations providing relief, recovery and rebuilding assistance to flood victims in the 24 FEMA designated emergency counties. The One SC Fund will continue to support the work of serving those impacted by the flood. It will also support nonprofit organizations providing relief, recovery and rebuilding assistance to those impacted by Hurricane Matthew. The need is great. Donations to the One SC Fund are being accepted and will help continue the work of serving those impacted by the disasters that have hit our state.

Purpose of the Fund

Grants will fund relief, recovery and rebuilding assistance provided by nonprofit organizations to victims of Hurricane Matthew. Grants will also fund rebuilding efforts for flood victims in the 24 FEMA designated emergency counties. Organizations may request up to \$25,000.

The Application

The online application will require your organization to describe the:

- Relief and recovery efforts to be implemented
- Project outcome(s)
- Geographic area(s) served
- Number of families/individuals to be served
- How the families/individuals served will be chosen
- Project partners
- Total project budget
- Requested grant amount
- Additional dollars that will be contributed (leveraged) using this grant

What Will Not Be Funded

- Projects not associated with relief, recovery or rebuilding efforts for the impacted regions of SC
- Routine operating expenses of the organization
- Fundraising projects
- Endowment development or capital campaigns
- Sponsorships

Eligible Geographic Areas

Applications for assistance following Hurricane Matthew will be limited to the areas affected by this disaster.

Applications for rebuilding projects following October 2015 floods will be accepted from organizations in the 24 FEMA designated emergency counties: Bamberg, Berkeley, Calhoun, Charleston, Clarendon, Colleton, Darlington, Dorchester, Fairfield, Florence, Georgetown, Greenville, Greenwood, Horry, Kershaw, Lee, Lexington, Marion, Newberry, Orangeburg, Richland, Spartanburg, Sumter and Williamsburg.

Application Requirements

An organization must:

- Be classified by the Internal Revenue Service as a tax-exempt, 501(c)(3), nonprofit entity or must make use of a fiscal agent that has a 501(c)(3) designation.
- Be based within or serve the areas affected by the disaster(s)
- Complete an online application
- Provide a detailed project budget

Additional Notes

- An organization may request up to \$25,000.
- Central Carolina Community Foundation intends to release 100% of funds awarded to each successful applicant at the beginning of the project period.
- The project period is six months

Review Process

The review committee will consist of members of the Community Foundation Board of Trustees and an Advisory Committee made up of community members
